

The PSSC Interactive Financial Spreadsheets

What? The Pharmacy Services Support Center (PSSC) has developed two interactive financial spreadsheets: The Interactive Contract Pharmacy Financial Spreadsheet and the Interactive In-House Pharmacy Financial Spreadsheet. The tools allow entities to enter data regarding their pharmacy payor types, prescription volume, capture rates, sliding fee scales and expenses to help the entities forecast the financial outcomes of an in-house or contract pharmacy program. The tools have been developed to account for a variety of factors and can predict a program's financial performance to the degree that accurate data is entered to reflect a particular health center and its pharmacy program.

Why? These financial modeling tools have been developed for health center administrators to use in implementing a new pharmacy program or revising an existing one. The financial spreadsheets should be used to help entities complete a comprehensive financial analysis of their pharmacy programs.

How? These tools were developed by PSSC in cooperation with Medicine for People in Need (www.medpin.org). PSSC was established through a contract between the American Pharmacists Association (APhA) and the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA).
